


# CAVES DWELLINGS


Bhalil village, in the Middle Atlas Mountains of Morocco, is famous for its troglodyte dwellings. It is said that there are 600 caves in the historic part of the village, some of which have been specially converted into tourist accommodation.

The troglodyte dwellings are carved into the cliffside and are decorated in traditional style with objects from past times and textiles in vibrant colours. Entering the caves, with their cool temperatures, feels like entering another world. (Food and drink are available in some caves.)
